The Lord Lyon has been informed. <p>(e) Treasurer's Report</p> <p>Christina McKenzie provided the following information: Our total balance is now £2,873. This is composed of set asides and a free balance: £400 Environment; £119 Floral Enhancement; £2,105 FETA Grant; £249 Free Balance.</p> <p>(f) Secretary and Correspondence</p> <p>Karen Trotter read out the list of correspondence received over the last month. Once the community company is formed (expected early 2006), it will undertake a 2-3 year fundraising process, using the funds raised in the earlier stages to pay for help in applying for larger funds.
